Spotlighting Weetangera

Maths in Art is a fun way of learning geometric principles.
Three different artworks are on display:

1. Parabolic Lines - many interesting artworks can be created with this optical illusion of straight lines becoming curved. Any shape can be used as long as you take the furthest line to the closest.
2. Rotational Symmetry - this kaleidoscope effect is created by designing one sector and rotating it through 360° .
3. Transformational Geometry - Flip (reflection), slide (translation) and turn (rotation). The first pattern is used as a template. Students then decide on the transformation they would like to apply.
