

At Weetangera a focus for learning in 2019 has been around developing our students as writers. We know that successful writers articulate for a range of purposes, and when the purpose changes, so does the text form.

Effective writers also draw on a range of skills while writing: generating ideas for

writing, organising ideas so that they are sequenced and coherent, selecting words carefully, writing sentences that make sense, are grammatically correct and flow, apply spelling knowledge, apply punctuation knowledge, proofreading checking spelling, punctuation and the writing makes sense and recrafting making changes to the text to improve the content and message.


At Weetangera School in 2019 we have used the elements of *Time* and *Response* to underpin the guiding principles for writing. This has been achieved through setting individual writing goals, conferencing with teachers to move learning forward and providing the time for students to practise the craft of writing across a range of purposes.


